Take Pride in Klukwan Keep Streets & Yards Free of Trash!

Trash in the bear proof bins must be pre-bagged and lids have to latch closed to prevent animals from throwing trash in people’s yards. Diapers & pet feces should be double bagged. Let the CIV Office know if you have larger items that need to be picked.

Not everything can be put in the trash. Hazardous waste needs special handling. What is hazardous waste?

- Paint
- Pesticides
- Propane tanks
- Batteries
- Pharmaceuticals
- Used motor oil and filters
- Fuels
- Many cleaning products
- Fluorescent tubes & light bulbs



Hazardous waste & dead electronics can be dropped off at the Recycling Center behind the

CIV Office. Never let hazardous waste sit in grass or dirt, where it can go straight into our water supply and harm the salmon we depend on!

Got A Lot of Trash?

The CIV Landfill is locked to prevent trespassing and illegal dumping. For self haul trash drop off, determine if your trash is burnable or non-burnable. Contact Bev Klanott to make arrangements, and a staff member will go with you.


